Reflecting on A Year of Loss and Resilience

And Finding Hope in the Women We Serve & Our Community

As our 45th Anniversary year comes to a close, we reflect on the many years Abby's House has held open the doors to homeless and low-income women and their children. We have stayed true to our values of hospitality and compassion, with open arms for any woman who seeks safety, healing, and empowerment. As a woman enters the door of the Abby's House Shelter, they are welcomed by a staff member or volunteer. They enter a room with a newly made bed of new linens, with new towels and toiletries waiting for them. With fellow guests, they break bread around the dinner table together, enjoying a meal crafted with donations from supporters, and recreating a scene that has taken place each night for 45 years. There is a common theme throughout our values and our properties-we all belong here. We live by the words of our namesake Abby Kelley Foster, one of Worcester's most famous abolitionists and women's rights activists, "All the great family of mankind are bound up in one bundle."

A vision for a welcoming and compassionate home for women, with or without children, led the Abby's House founders to open a 9-bed shelter at 23 Crown Street in 1976. The Shelter was one of the first in the United States for women, creating a new space for women to find safety, dignity, and hope. Throughout the years, **your unwavering support has helped us grow from one property to four and serve over 15,000 women and children**—offering a 9-bed shelter, 7 two-bedroom apartments, and 72 single room supportive housing units. Abby's words come alive here, where women are empowered to realize and achieve their goals.

In the last year and a half, however, we found cracks appearing in our vibrant community as a pandemic impacted lives. We faced a collective loss—loss of our sense of normalcy, loss of our personal connections, and loss of life. We lost beautiful souls in the past year, women and supporters who were part of the mosaic of the Abby's House community.

The pandemic created additional difficulties and laid bare women's past traumas. 74% of the women of Abby's House report experiencing prior traumatic interpersonal violence in their lives. Yet Abby's House Shelter Advocate, Parlee Jones witnesses women coming together through these difficult journeys, "Some of our guests create bonds of sisterhood." The women at Abby's showed their strength and resilience during the past 2 years joining together in friendship to uplift and strengthen one another. Much like Abby, the women who live here pave the way for their fellow residents and guests to empower themselves.

In her speech at the National Woman's Rights Convention, Abby Kelley Foster remarked, "Bloody feet, Sisters, have worn smooth the path by which you come hither." We saw out of our collective loss, an outpouring of support from you and strength and resiliency in the women of Abby's House. Whether you volunteered your talents, provided donations or were there—to support, to share, to spread kindness. **All the losses, the cracks in our community, you have filled with hope when we needed it most.** You help wear smooth the path so the women and children of Abby's House can find safety, healing, and new beginnings even in difficult times. We look forward to a better year ahead and opportunities to be together in support of the women and children.

The COVID-19 pandemic has reinforced that life is full of uncertainties and that we never know what is around the corner.

For 45 years, Abby's House has been helping women who experience this reality firsthand. They find themselves without a safe home due to rising housing costs, a loss of income, domestic violence, a lack of a safety net, a mental or physical illness, or other reasons.

In the very first shelter Daily Log entry in 1976, volunteer Suzanne Geaney wrote, "Our first guest was

Rosemary, an 18 year old girl, referred by the Crisis Center. She was our only guest this first night and she was soon enlisted into helping us do dishes..." Since Rosemary, thousands of women have entered through the shelter doors of Abby's House to be welcomed by a volunteer. Volunteers staffed 232 nights in the shelter in 2020 during COVID – a true testament to the 45 years of steadfast volunteer commitment!

Together, with nearly 200 volunteers and 3,600 donors each year, Abby's House continues to be the "Bright Spot" for women facing uncertainty and fear. We are present during their most difficult times, and we remain a steady source of hope, helping women to meet each moment and weather any storm. You make it all possible.

Thank you for being the "Bright Spot" for Rosemary and many more women and children over the past 45 years and for continuing to be there in the days ahead.

Family Comes Together to Build a Lasting Legacy


